

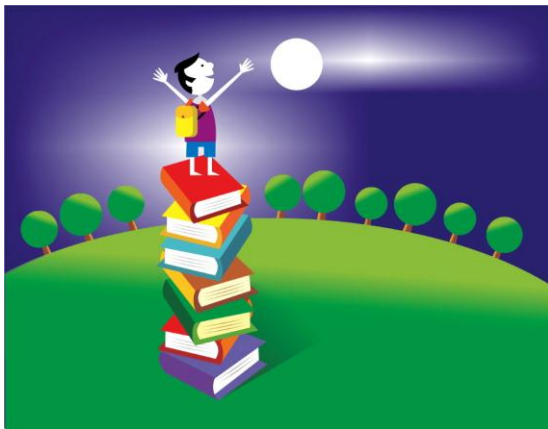
Calendar-Inspired Reading

Strong readers tend to do better in all subjects. With these activities, your child will get a little extra reading practice on a regular basis:

September was National Blueberry Popsicle Month! Encourage your youngster to find unusual day, week, or month celebrations in library books or online – he'll be reading nonfiction and doing research without even realizing it. He might also look up birthdays of famous people, like his favourite authors and athletes. Add those special days to your calendar too.

Take turns writing a question or challenge of the week on Sunday's calendar square.

Example: A baby llama is a *cria*. Find other names for different baby animals. Throughout the week, family members can read books, magazines, or websites to find answers and share what they discover!



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
