Hello Thornton Families,

This week saw Thornton's Culture of Peace recognized by the ME to We foundation and the local media for their efforts to develop student leaders and for their efforts to raise awareness of issues of social justice. Thornton staff and students also attended the ME to We day in Toronto and heard from a variety of inspirational speakers and artists.

On Monday, Thornton was given an additional intermediate class by the Board which resulted in a significant amount of movement across grades 1 to 8. Additional staff had to be hired, timetables altered and students moved from their original class placements. The overall impact of the changes will mean that the student teacher ratio in the Junior and Intermediate divisions was significantly lowered. I appreciate that for some the transition to a new class may be difficult and staff will be working with those new students to their rooms to make the transition a smooth one.

The Cross-Country team competed in their first meet this past week and put forth an amazing effort. Our runners have continued to train at lunch three days a week and are looking forward to competing at the Thornton Thump on Wednesday. The Junior soccer team continues to practice in preparation for their first games this week as well. The Intermediate boys and girls volleyball teams are working hard with the girls winning their first match of the season. The Pop Rocks Choir began meeting this week as well.
