



Kiss and Ride Update

Here are a few reminders to ensure our Kiss & Ride lane is efficient and, most importantly, safe:

- ◆ Pull up as far as you can – to the yellow KISS AND RIDE DROP OFF sign and the second PARENT DROP OFF sign. **Please do not let your children exit your vehicle until you are at the end of the driveway.** This includes Kindergarten students. The Kindergarten students will enter the Kindergarten yard at the far gate. Do not stop to drop them off in the middle of the driveway. We will ask you to move to the end of the driveway. **Please do not park in the Kiss and Ride lane, and get out. Our staff are there to assist your child.**

Letting them out earlier puts them at risk and slows down traffic.

- ◆ Ensure your children exit your vehicle on the school side only.
- ◆ Stay in your vehicle. Our staff are there to assist your children and to keep the traffic flowing smoothly.
- ◆ Have backpacks, lunch kits, umbrellas, snow pants, mittens, etc. in the vehicle, not the trunk. Make sure your children are ready to get out as soon as the door is opened.
- ◆ Be patient in inclement weather. Traffic volume is much heavier on rainy, snowy days and cold days.
- ◆ Arrive early to beat the rush. Yard supervision starts at 8:05 a.m. Your children need to be ready to learn at 8:20 a.m.
- ◆ Park and walk your child to class if your child is anxious or upset.
- ◆ Do not park in the staff parking lot or on the side of the driveway – these are blocked off for safety. If you need to park, use the far municipal parking lot. See the website for clarification if you are unsure.
- ◆ Be kind to our staff. Some of them are parents just like you and the Kiss & Ride program is a privilege.
- ◆ Volunteer to help with the Kiss & Ride. Helping out even one morning or after school a week for 20 minutes makes a big difference! Contact Lisa Hill if you are interested.
